

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Needs Assessment

This educational program will review the latest diagnostic and treatment options for Tourette syndrome (TS) and associated co-morbidities, review updates on research into TS genetics and pathophysiology, and provide information about helping individuals with TS and their families navigate the educational system. The program includes an independent track for educators and families that will cover medical, behavioral, and classroom strategies for recognizing and managing symptoms, and will provide an opportunity for a panel discussion with local and national experts in the field.
